Listening & Appraising	 Know that music has a steady pulse, like a heartbeat. Some children will know that we can create rhythms from words, our names, favourite food, colours and animals. Recognise and name two or more instruments they hear, e.g. male vocal, bass guitar, drums, decks. 	 Know that music has a steady pulse, like a heartbeat. Identify 5 different musical styles; Blues, Baroque, Latin, Irish Folk, Funk and name some of them. Dance to each style or move to the pulse – be "In The Groove!" 	 Know that music has a steady pulse, like a heartbeat. Some children will know that we can create rhythms from words, our names, favourite food, colours and animals. Recognise and name two or more instruments they hear, e.g. keyboard, drums, bass, a female singer.
Singing & Performing Composition & Improvisation	 Find the pulse. Clap rhythms: copying back rhythms they hear, clap their own rhythms over the track. Sing & rap in time to the music. Play instrumental parts accurately and in time as part of the performance. Play the note 'C'. Compose a simple melody using simple rhythms, using the notes 'C' & 'D'. 	 Find the pulse, by marching or copying actions. Clap rhythms: copying back rhythms they hear, clap their own rhythms over the track. Sing together and in time, in all the different styles. Play instrumental parts accurately and in time as part of the performance. Play the note 'C'. Compose a simple melody using simple rhythms, using the notes 'C' & 'D'. 	 Find the pulse. Clap rhythms: copying and creating using names, colours, animals. Sing in unison and in two parts. Play instrumental parts accurately and in time as part of the performance. Play the note 'C'.
