
RE–Morning/Afternoon Prayer

<p>Communication and language –</p> <p>Listen to the story – Star in a jar</p> 	<p>PE/Physical Development –</p> <p>Join in with cosmic kids – Spooky spectacular-super yoga</p> 	<p>Maths –</p> <p>Make a tray with some cut out star shapes and hide them amongst e.g. Rice, pasta, lentils, pieces of paper etc...</p> <p>Encourage your child to explore the tray and ask them ‘How many stars can you find?’</p>	<p>Communication and language –</p> <p>Show your child pictures of stars from the internet. When it goes dark at bed time, look out of the window with your child and if you can see any stars in the sky.</p>	<p>Personal, social and emotional development-</p> <p>Talk about bonfire night, loud noises, fires etc... talk about how the noises make us feel and then talk with your child about keeping safe during fireworks.</p> <p>You can watch this sort video from newsround about bonfire night safety.</p>
<p>Monday</p> <p>Make a ‘star scope’ Using a cardboard tube (loo roll, paper towel), an elastic band, and a circle of black paper larger than the end of the tube. Make a pattern of holes in the centre of the black paper, using the pointed end of a pen or pencil. Fix on to one the end of the tube with a rubber band. Shine a torch through the other end to show your very own constellation pattern on the wall/ceiling.</p>	<p>Tuesday</p> <p>Shadows – Make shadows using your hands. Place a torch in the desired position or stand by a light and make a shadow on the wall or floor. Encourage your child to do the same. What shapes can you make?</p>	<p>Wednesday</p> <p>Personal, social and emotional development-</p> <p>Make a den with your child, it can be simple with just a sheet over a chair or it can be extravagant with different colour materials and even lights inside. Allow them to help make choices and prepare the den.</p> <p>Then get in the den with your child and read a story together.</p>	<p>Thursday</p> <p>Physical development – pencil control, on a sheet of paper, draw a few short faint lines. Encourage your child to draw over them. Ask the children if they can draw a circle. If you have child friendly scissors, then they could also cut along the lines.</p>	<p>Friday</p> <p>Creative – Using black card, various colour paints and a straw. Place a few blobs of coloured paint onto your card and then encourage your child to blow the paint through the straw, to make a beautiful firework picture.</p>
