Communication and language – What's out of the window – Stand or sit with your child, looking out of a window. Just look for a little while and see if they point anything out to you.	Personal, social and emotional development- Make a photo-book of funny, or memorable, family events and talk about it with your child.	Physical Development – <u>Watch the video and sing along</u> <u>with your child, encouraging</u> <u>them to join in with the actions</u> .	Understanding the world - Take one of your child's favourite toys, it can be a bear, doll or even a figure. Go out for a walk if you can, or go into the garden and take some pictures on your phone of your child with their toy, doing different things.	Personal, social and emotional development- Wash the toys – Get some of your child's toys and make them dirty. Fill a bowl with soapy water and encourage your child to clean them with a flannel, sponge etc

Expressive art and design- After they've had enough of looking out of the window, encourage them to draw a picture of what they have seen. Please don't forget to upload your photographs.	Physical Development – Move to the music - On the spot can you start by clapping in time to the music? Keep clapping but can you now move your feet in time to the music by marching on the spot? Now can you start to walk around the space by clapping and walking in time to the music?	Maths – Matching shapes - Draw a large circle, square and triangle on a piece of paper each. Then cut out some of each shape but smaller, mix them up and help your child to place them in the correct shape.	Communication and language – Send the pictures that you have taken to a family member or show someone at home and then encourage your child to talk to them about where their special toy has been and what they've been up to.	Expressive art and design- Collage – You need, paper, glue and bits of different materials e.g. Coloured paper, shiny paper, ribbon, string, material. Cut up the materials needed into small manageable pieces, then allow your child to collage freely.
