Prime Areas of Learning	
PSED	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✓ Expresses own preferences and interests ✓ Aware of own feelings, and knows that some actions and words can hurt others' feelings.
Physical Development	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✓ Experiments with different ways of moving. ✓ Initiates conversations, attends to and takes account of what others say. ✓ Handles tools, objects, construction and malleable materials safely and with increasing control.
Communication & Language	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✓ Maintains attention, concentrates and sits quietly during appropriate activity. ✓ Two-channelled attention – can listen and do for short span. ✓ Extends vocabulary, especially by grouping and naming, exploring the meaning and sounds of new words. ✓ Uses language to imagine and recreate roles and experiences in play situations. ✓ Listens and responds to ideas expressed by others in conversation or discussion. ✓ Links statements and sticks to a main theme or intention. ✓ Uses talk to organise, sequence and clarify thinking, ideas, feelings and events.

Literacy	<p>Reading</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✓ Continues a rhyming string. ✓ Hears and says the initial sound in words. ✓ Enjoys an increasing range of books, ✓ Can segment the sounds in simple words and blend them together and knows which letters represent some of them. ✓ Knows that information can be retrieved from books and computers. <p>Writing</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✓ Links sounds to letters, naming and sounding the letters of the alphabet.
Mathematical Development	<p>Numbers</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✓ Counts objects to 10, and beginning to count beyond 20. ✓ Counts out up to six objects from a larger group. ✓ Selects the correct numeral to represent 1 to 5, then 1 to 20 objects. ✓ Counts an irregular arrangement of up to ten objects. ✓ Finds the total number of items in two groups by counting all of them. ✓ Use the language of 'more' and 'fewer' to compare two sets of objects.
