<image/>	You may wish to provide your child with a teddy bear head band or you may wish to make your own by simply cutting a strip of paper, measuring your child's head and sticking the edges together. Draw 2 round circles and cut and stick them onto the side of the head band to represent teddy bear ears. Show the different pictures of the characters and ask the children how they can move in different ways like the characters. Ask them questions such as: • What would Daddy Bear move like? • What would Mummy Bear move like? • How would Baby Bear move? Continuous provision idea You may wish to provide your child with the different pictures from the story provided. Encourage your child to cut out the pictures and place them in order of size from smallest to largest.	idea/Understanding of the world/ PSED You may wish to give your child some porridge oats. Pour them into a bowl and add some water. Encourage your child to place their hands in the porridge, see if they can describe to you what it feels like. Pour some water into some porridge oats, see if your child can talk about what has happened to the oats when water has been added. Continuous provision idea Ask if your child if they have a favourite teddy bear. Encourage them to draw their own. They may wish to use the template provided or design their own.	You may wish to provide your child with a wooden spoon or a plastic spoon and encourage them to make a character from the story 'Goldilocks and the three bears.' This could simply be by using felt tip pens and encouraging your child to make the faces. They can decide if they would like to make Mummy Bear, Daddy Bear, Baby Bear or Goldilocks. You could if you wish use craft bits to make hair, eyes, mouth, e.t.c

Once your child has learnt the lyrics to the nursery rhyme, encourage them to move in time to the song	Sing Nursery rhyme of the week and other nursery rhymes that your child may know. If they have toy musical instruments at home, it may be worth encouraging them to sing and shake their musical instruments at the same time. Your child may wish to walk/march/jump/clap as well as singing and shaking the musical instrument.	Show your child the video of parts of the face in Spanish. Encourage them to listen carefully to the way that the person is pronouncing the words and ask them to repeat these to you in Spanish.	Pretend to your child that the letter attached has been delivered to your house. Show your child the different people from the story. Place some bowls in front of your child. Read the different statements from each person. You could use porridge or any cereal to place into a bowl and ask your child to place the correct quantity to match the person. You could also use pretend food.
