Collective Worship

Collective Worship at the Federation of St. Cuthbert's and St. Sebastian's Catholic Primary Schools, provides opportunities for pupils and staff to come together to worship God. Our schools are a Catholic foundation and therefore, whilst respecting diversity of belief and commitment, reflects and follows the traditions of the Church and has Christ at its heart.

Collective Worship celebrates the presence of God in all our lives. It is an invitation to all our children, staff and families to enter into a relationship with God, which is personal and unique.

Collective Worship in our school takes account of the religious and educational needs of all who share in it:

- Those from supportive Catholic homes
- Those for who school may be their first and only experience of Church.
- Those from other Christian backgrounds
- Those from other faith backgrounds.

Aims for Collective Worship

- To promote and develop an appreciation of more active participation in prayer, liturgy and worship, relevant to the age and experience of each child.
- To consider spiritual and moral issues and to explore their own beliefs.
- To be respectful and reverent towards beliefs of others.
- To reinforce positive attitudes to prayer.
- To develop links with the parish community.
- To develop a common ethos and shared values.
- To enrich religious experience.
- To reinforce home/school/parish links.
- To foster a sense of wonder and joy in creation and to promote an understanding of responsibility for their world.
- To affirm and develop individual dignity.
- To give children the opportunity to build a personal relationship with God.

Legal Requirement

We acknowledge that there must be a daily act of worship for all pupils. This can take place at any time during the school day and can be either a single act of worship for all pupils or separate acts of worship in year or class groups.

The act of worship is not designated curriculum time and is not to be subsumed under any part of the curriculum including religious education.

Forms of Collective Worship

1. Daily Collective Worship in Class

Each class gathers for a daily act of prayer and liturgy when there are no whole class assemblies or celebrations planned. This takes place as part of the class timetable; all classes have a focus table / area with various resources to support this. Sessions are linked to the Gospel Value and delivered by class teachers / children, reflective of the children's age.

2. Daily Prayers

Each class will say daily prayers. These will take place in the morning, at the end of the school day as well as before / after lunch.

3. Whole School Collective Worship

The whole school gathers for a weekly worship session planned and delivered by class teachers and children. Class Teachers are also responsible for the planning of Little Church, ensuring appropriate resources / scripture are shared allowing equity for all across our Collective Worship provision.

4. Whole School Celebrations

Throughout the year whole school celebrations will take place within our school, these include:

- St. Cuthbert's & St. Sebastian's Feast Day
- Advent / Christmas Services
- Holy Week / Easter Celebration

5. School Community Masses / Services

An annual timetable is shared outlining Masses and Services to be led by our children along with Fr. Liam and our school community — they take place in school or our local parish (SC — St. Oswald's / SS- St. Sebastian's).

6. Stay and Pray

Throughout the academic year, each class invite parents and family members into school to share within 'Stay and Pray', these sessions are often based on Come & See Respond activities or Gospel Values.

7. Staff/ Governors Collective Worship

Each staff / governors gather each month for Collective Worship. At times throughout the academic year, staff meetings begin with prayer often related to an event, the liturgical year or feast day where appropriate.

Planning, Recording and Evaluating of Collective Worships

Planned

- Using the accepted four-fold structure: gather, listen, respond and go forth.
- Containing the Word of God read from the Bible.
- Through references to the Church's season, significant dates and Gospel Values.
- With the flexibility to respond to changing situations within the school and wider community.
- Adequately resourced.

Recorded

- Through completion of Archdiocese planning document by both staff and children (where appropriate).
- Through weekly Twitter posts, prayers and photographs.

Evaluated

• By our school community on a regular basis (staff, pupils, governors and parents).

Monitoring

Collective Worship is monitored termly as part of the school cycle of monitoring and evaluation. This is led by the RE Lead, Collective Worship Committee, RE Governors and SLT.

Equal Opportunities and Inclusion

Every effort will be made to ensure frequent discussion of the Collective Worship Policy and provision take place in order to further develop our Faith Community. This is a continuous process requiring a close partnership between teacher, pupils and the involvement of others as appropriate.
