Homework

Homework Books – they will be sent home each Friday to be returned on Tuesday (alternate English / Maths each week).

Y3-Y6 - Reading Books – children will complete an AR Quiz when they have read their home reading book before selecting the next.

Reception, Y1 & Y2 - Read Write Inc. - books will be sent home each Wednesday and Read with Me Books each Friday.

Ed-Shed – weekly spellings will be uploaded to Ed-Shed. The minimum expectation is for children to access them 7 times per week. Each class will have a spelling challenge on Fridays.

TT Rock Stars – times tables underpin the mathematics curriculum and regular practice and consolidation is hugely important. Children will access a fluency challenge on Fridays.

Homework will be posted on Class Dojo each Friday.

Bagel Breakfast

Supported by the National Schools Breakfast Programme, Bagel Breakfast will be available for children to access when coming into school from Monday. It is our introductory week, so we may experience a few hiccups but are looking forward to providing a morning snack to our children. There is still time to volunteer!

Statutory Guidance from the DfE (August 2024) Working Together to improve school attendance:

Our school day starts at 8.45am

If children arrive at school between 8.46am-9.15am they will be marked as L – late. Children who are persistently late will be referred to our Attendance Officer and Education Welfare Officer.

If children arrive at school after 9:15am a 'U Code' (unauthorised absence) will be issued for the morning session. 10 U codes will automatically result in a penalty notice (an £80 fine which will increase to £160 if not paid within 28 days)

Holidays will not be authorised during term time. Holidays will result in a penalty notice (an £80 fine, per parent, which will increase to £160 if not paid within 28 days). If a second holiday is taken within a 3-year period, it will result in an automatic £160 fine, per parent.

Ensure children are in school on time, learning starts at 8:45am.
