Y1	Textiles - Emergency Services: Puppets <i>Use a range of materials creatively to design and make products.</i> CORE LEARNING (SKILLS & KNOWLEDGE) By the end of this unit, children will: - Complete hands-on research of existing puppets including materials, decoration, puppet type. - Know about a range of stitching, knotting and manipulative skills and be able to use them. - Create a puppet design to follow the emergency services briefing. - Create a puppet template/pattern, suitable to be used as a hand puppet. - Create a puppet that follows a design.	Painting - Royal family: portraits / coat of arms etc. <i>Develop a wide range of art and design techniques in using colour, pattern, texture, line, shape, form and space</i> CORE LEARNING (SKILLS & KNOWLEDGE) By the end of this unit, children will: - Mix secondary colours and shades using a variety of paints - Use a variety of brush types and sizes when practicing techniques including stippling, splattering, watercolour. - Research coat of arms and explore the features including a shield, supporters, a crest and a motto. - Sketch a design for a coat of arms including a shield, supporters, a crest and a motto. - Create a coat of arms which follows a design.	3D – Sculpture- Anthony Gormley <i>Use drawing, painting and sculpture to develop and share their ideas, experiences and imagination.</i> CORE LEARNING (SKILLS & KNOWLEDGE) By the end of this unit, children will: - Know about the sculptor Antony Gormley and his artwork - Be able to use clay in a variety of methods including kneading, molding and rolling. - Be able to talk about their own work and the work of others. - Draw vertical horizontal, diagonal and curved lines

Y3	Textiles – Stone Age Tunics CORE LEARNING (SKILLS & KNOWLEDGE) By the end of this unit, children will: - Research a variety of pre-historic clothing and know what materials are used. - Use overlapping and layering - Use a variety of stitches and joining methods (running stitch, backstitch, blanket stitch, cross stitch) - Create a design for a stone age tunic that is consistent with clothing from that time. - Create a stone age tunic following their design. - Evaluate their finished product and compare with others.	Printing – William Morris CORE LEARNING (SKILLS & KNOWLEDGE) By the end of this unit, children will: - Research the life and work of a print artist (William Morris) - Experiment using different printing techniques including relief printing. - Explore pattern and shaping using a print roller. - Design a wallpaper inspired by William Morris. - Make my own relief printing block on a card base using a variety of materials, e.g string and cardboard. - Print a wallpaper that follows a design, in the style of William Morris, using relief printing.	Egyptian Collage – Collage CORE LEARNING (SKILLS & KNOWLEDGE) By the end of this unit, children will: - Know about different types of Egyptian art. - Research Pharaoh portrait art. - Use sketching techniques to recreate a Pharaoh portrait including cross hatching, stippling and circling. - Be able to overlap and layer to create a collage. - Use two or more complementary materials within a collage.

Including hatching, cross hatching and stippling. - Create collages using different materials and techniques - Design a roman mosaic using tiles. - Make a roman mosaic, based on a design.	- Explore the life and work of Monet. - Compare impressionist art work with the work of Monet (Edouard Manet, Edgar Degas, Pierre-Auguste Renoir, Camille Pissarro) - Create an outdoor scene piece using oil painting. - Use a specific and developed colour vocabulary; tint, shade, hue, tone. - Create different effects and textures with paint; blocking in, washes, thickened paint. - Know which primary colours make secondary colours.	- Consider size, shape and space as factors when creating a site-specific sculpture such as the school playground. - Talk about how art can/will improve a place. - Create a sculpture using 'found' or recycled materials. - Discuss and use finishing techniques - Use different joining techniques including adhesives, frame joints, tape, staples. - Join clay adequately and independently and be able to use a range of modelling methods including smoothing, carving and using tools.

Y5	Textiles - Autumn Decorations CORE LEARNING (SKILLS & KNOWLEDGE) By the end of this unit, children will: - Research autumnal designs and gather aesthetic inspiration - Explore cushions, their design, shape and composition. - Join fabric by stitching including running stitch, cross stitch, back stitch and blanket stitch. - Use a range of techniques, colours and textures in the design and making process.	Painting & Collage – Painting and Collage (Henri Matisse) CORE LEARNING (SKILLS & KNOWLEDGE) By the end of this unit, children will: - Create imaginative work from a variety of sources. - Know about the life and work of Henri Matisse. - Use a range of media to create collage including newspapers, online images, magazines. - Experiment with decoupage by layering different sources and images to create a battle scene. - Express mood and emotion through art through colour and use of collage.	Printing – Picasso Printing CORE LEARNING (SKILLS & KNOWLEDGE) By the end of this unit, children will: - Understand how Picasso used bold shapes, lines and contrasts in his Lino prints. - Experiment with polystyrene life printing tools to create different lines and textures. - Design a print inspired by Picasso, using positive and negative space effectively. - Make a polystyrene printing tile by pressing lines and shapes accurately into the surface. - Ink and print their tile with control, improving their technique through test prints. - Evaluate their final print, explaining what worked well, what they improved and how Picasso influenced their design.

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Y6	Painting - LS Lowry (Liverpool-themed war scenes) CORE LEARNING (SKILLS & KNOWLEDGE) By the end of this unit, children will: • Explain what a tint and shade is, how they are created and be able to create shades and tints • Show awareness of the composition of paintings. • Critique the work of an artist by using opinion and comparing to other artists. • Combine the elements of art – line, tone, pattern, texture, form, space, colour and shape. • Create a Liverpool skyline in the style of LS Lowry.	3D - Scale Models CORE LEARNING (SKILLS & KNOWLEDGE) By the end of this unit, children will: • Know about the life and work of Tom Murphy. • Use clay in a variety of techniques including smoothing, carving and the use of tools to create holes and hollows. • Create a sculpture based on an inspirational person.	Digital Design & Printing – Digital Design CORE LEARNING (SKILLS & KNOWLEDGE) By the end of this unit, children will: • Know about Mike Barrett and his digital artwork. • Use various painting apps to experiment including 'Paint' and 'Sumo Paint.' • Use a range of techniques to collate ideas including photographs and sketching. • Use a paint app to create a piece of digital artwork.
